Dear Parishioners,



The first two readings today are filled with all kinds of encouragement. The gospel is the selection that is often cited in discussions about the relationship between government and religion. We surely need the spirit fostered by the first and second reading; people are still trying to figure out the proper balance between state and church.

The reading from Isaiah begins with a beautiful image: "Thus says the Lord to his anointed Cyrus, whose right hand I grasp ..." Images like this from scripture remind us of the nearness of God, so close to us that He grasps us by the hand. At times, our faith highlights the mystery and transcendence of God. Certainly, there is truth in those attributes we use to describe God; yet, we can never lose sight of the personal relationship that God desires for each one of us that brings Him so directly and closely into the daily events of our lives. This first reading is filled with images of the involvement of God in our lives. Bette Midler sang a song years ago about God as a "God of distance." How wrong she was. She may have been a wonderful singer; she was a poor theologian.

The middle reading from Saint Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians is filled with encouragement. We are hearing today the very beginning of the reading as Paul greets the Thessalonians in the name of "God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: grace to you and peace". Paul then expresses his sense of gratitude for these people and assures them of his prayers for them. These are wonderful gifts that we continue to extend to those close to us: gratitude and prayer. We all enjoy an expression of thanks from people that matter to us. We all feel blessed when we know others pray for us. As important as it is to receive these gifts, today's readings remind us to pass along those gifts. Making a habit of gratitude and saying "thank you" is a great practice. Holding people close in prayer helps us all be mindful of the nearness of God and the holiness of each our lives.

The gospel story leads to the conversation between the delegates of the Pharisees and Jesus about the census tax and Jesus' famous response, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." Sometimes we hear this discussion when politics and religion, church and state are involved. Some families even ban such discussion from the dinner table! It can be a volatile mix because people have such strong convictions about the topic. It touches many values that people hold dear.

life issues, education issues, freedom to worship issues, immigration policies, justice matters and many more are all topics that touch upon the relationship of church and state, government and religion. Some believe faith and religion are "purely personal matters" and religion and its values do not enter into the public debate of issues of the day. Others believe we live our faith in everyday life and our faith matters greatly in all that we do. This attitude is more reflective of a Catholic understanding. Catholicism is personal, but our faith is shared and brought to bear in decisions we make. Catholicism has a very public dimension to it.

This issue of church and state has a long history in the United States. There is a renewed interest in the place and practice of religion of our Founding Fathers. Religious discrimination has long been a part of the history of religion in our country. The election of John Kennedy as a Catholic president is seen as a very significant event. In recent years the Bishops of our country have made significant statements and offered important teachings on many critical social issues. The Church has a long and positive history in contributing to the educational, health, and social needs of people of all faiths in the United States. What is sometimes referred to as "the religious right" is playing a role in shaping the debates of the next presidential election. We pray for our nation and our flag flies tall atop our Catholic school. Patriotism is a virtue. Jesus himself engaged in the conversation about the relationship of church and state.

Next Sunday at the 11:45AM Mass, Bishop Walsh will come to the parish to install me as the tenth pastor of Saint Anne Parish. All are invited to the Mass and to the social that will follow in the McCloskey Auditorium. Please know it is a great privilege and a joy to be your pastor. These past four months have been very happy ones for me and I am grateful to the parish for your warm welcome. I know that I have much to learn about the parish, all the people, and all the families. It will be a long learning process and it will be filled with lots of good, holy, and blessed experiences as I come to know you and grow in my love for you, the parish of Saint Anne. It is an exciting time and time of much anticipation as we will seek to come to know, love, and serve the Lord in the days ahead. If you are able to share in the 11:45AM Mass next Sunday, please do so. Many thanks.

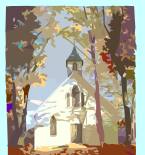

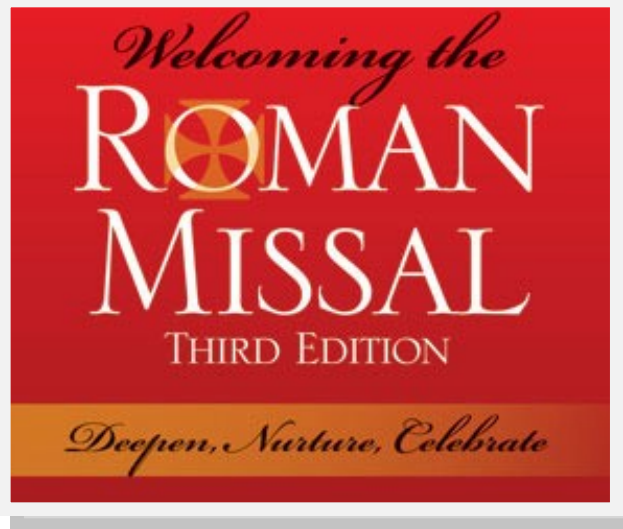

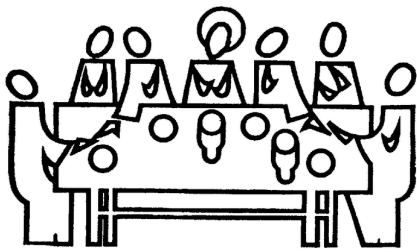
REVISED ROMAN MISSAL

Having reflected upon the Liturgy of the Word, this week we explore the second major part of the Mass – the **Liturgy of the Eucharist**. It's important to remember that while there are two major parts to the Mass, it is ONE Mass. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states, "The Mass is made up, as it were, of two parts: the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. These, however, are so closely interconnected that they form but one single act of worship" (28). We'll look at the different parts of the Liturgy of the Eucharist over the next three weeks.

The two high points of the Liturgy of the Eucharist are the Eucharistic Prayer and the sharing of communion. Everything else helps us to prepare for and move from those two moments, including the Preparation of the Gifts.

Preparation of the Gifts

Immediately after the Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful), the altar is prepared and the gifts of bread and wine are brought forward. Preparation of the altar includes placing the corporal, Roman Missal, and chalices to be used for the Eucharistic meal. Then, the gifts of bread and wine are brought



forward. In our history, the bread and wine were prepared by the community and it was literally the community's offering. Today, that has been adapted as hosts and wine are usually purchased for use. Yet, the procession of gifts is important. It symbolizes that the community – each one of us – brings forth what we have to the Eucharist. (This is also symbolized by our singing!) **Beginning on the weekend November 5/6, 2011, we will increase the number of gifts brought forward at the procession to more fully enrich this symbolic act.** In

some communities, the offering of money – the collection – is brought forward at this time.

Blessing

The blessing prayers take place immediately after the bread and wine have been prepared. The priest raises the bread and then the wine SLIGHTLY above the altar seeking God's blessing. Note the use of the "we" here – "Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation, for through your goodness **we** have received the bread **we** offer you..." The sacrifice of bread and wine is not the offering of the priest alone, but of the entire assembly.

These blessing prayers can be said in a low voice if there is signing and aloud if there is no singing. When the prayers are said aloud, we respond, "Blessed be God for ever." There is no change in this response in the new translation.

Invitation to Prayer

Here the priest invites us to pray that God will accept our sacrifice by saying, "Pray brethren (brothers and sisters) that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." The revised translation specifically indicates that this is not the priest's sacrifice alone. It is his sacrifice and ours. We are not passive observers, but actively offer the sacrifice.

We respond to the invitation by saying, "May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His **holy** Church." The only addition to this in the new translation is the addition of the word holy.

Prayer over the Offerings

This concludes the Preparation of the Gifts. Usually this prayer asks God to accept the offerings. We respond by saying, AMEN. The Eucharistic Prayer begins immediately after this prayer and that will be our focus next week.

These Masses have just been added to our Mass calendar and intentions are available.



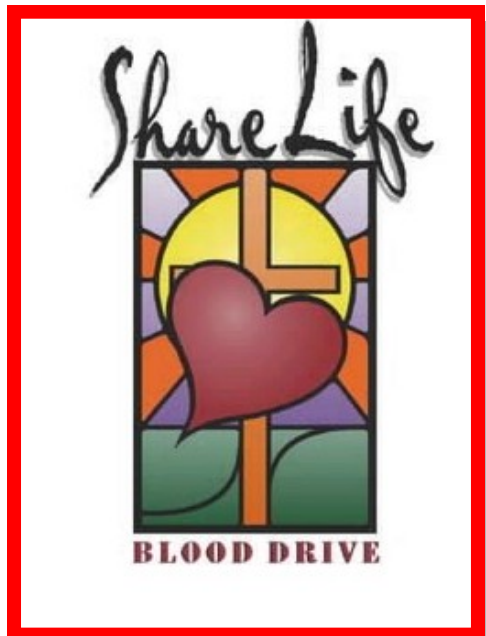
